



2010 IPC SWIMMING WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS ENTRY CRITERIA FOR S14 CLASS

Events for male & female S14 class

200m Freestyle
100m Backstroke
100m Breaststroke

Maximum entries per NPC

There can be a maximum of 8 athletes/NPC (max. 4 male and max. 4 female), of which a maximum of 2 athletes may have N sport class status.

Each NPC can enter a maximum of 2 (two) athletes per event.

Minimum Qualification Standards (MQS)

No MQS apply for the competition in absence of baseline data.

Sport Entry Process

1. The S14 Swimmer **MUST** be listed on the [INAS-FID](http://www.inas-fid.org) Classification Master List under the sport of 'Swimming' as published on 30 June 2010. Information on how to register through INAS-FID can be retrieved from <http://www.inas-fid.org/athletereg.html>.
2. S14 athletes require an IPC Swimming Athlete License, validated no later than the date of Final Entry (02 July 2010).
3. All N status athletes will participate in the on-site sport-specific testing (computer-based test battery) upon arrival at the World Championships. Failure to present for the sport-specific testing results leads to disqualification and the athlete will be recorded with sport class 'ineligible to compete'.
4. S14 athletes (*) who have previously participated in on-site testing at previous occasion are allocated 'R' (Review) status in accordance with

the IPC Classification Code, but will NOT be required to attend classification upon arrival at the World Championships.

*: these are athletes who participated in the testing at the 2009 INAS-FID Global Games, 2009 Asian Youth Para Games, and 2009 IPC Swimming European Championships.

5. Observation in Competition

5.1. All athletes are subject to observation in competition.

5.2. The ID-classifier has the mandate to exercise the right of 'Protest under Exceptional Circumstances' (IPC Classification Code, IS Protest and Appeals, section 5) in the case of appraisal of inconsistencies between observations in competition and test-profiles derived from the on-site testing. This protest resolution may include the review of 'primary evidence' and the re-assessment with the on-site sport-specific testing. Inconsistent findings may lead to the disqualification of the athlete from further participation in the Championships. The athlete will be recorded with sport class 'ineligible to compete'.

Results and Rankings

1. The events will be granted full-medal event status.
2. Results and rankings will be recorded by IPC in accordance with the provisions set forth in the IPC Sport Data Management System policies.

Records

World and Regional records will not be recorded at this stage.

Financial regulations

1. The athlete License is non-refundable in the case of ineligibility.
2. The competition fee is non-refundable in the case of ineligibility.
